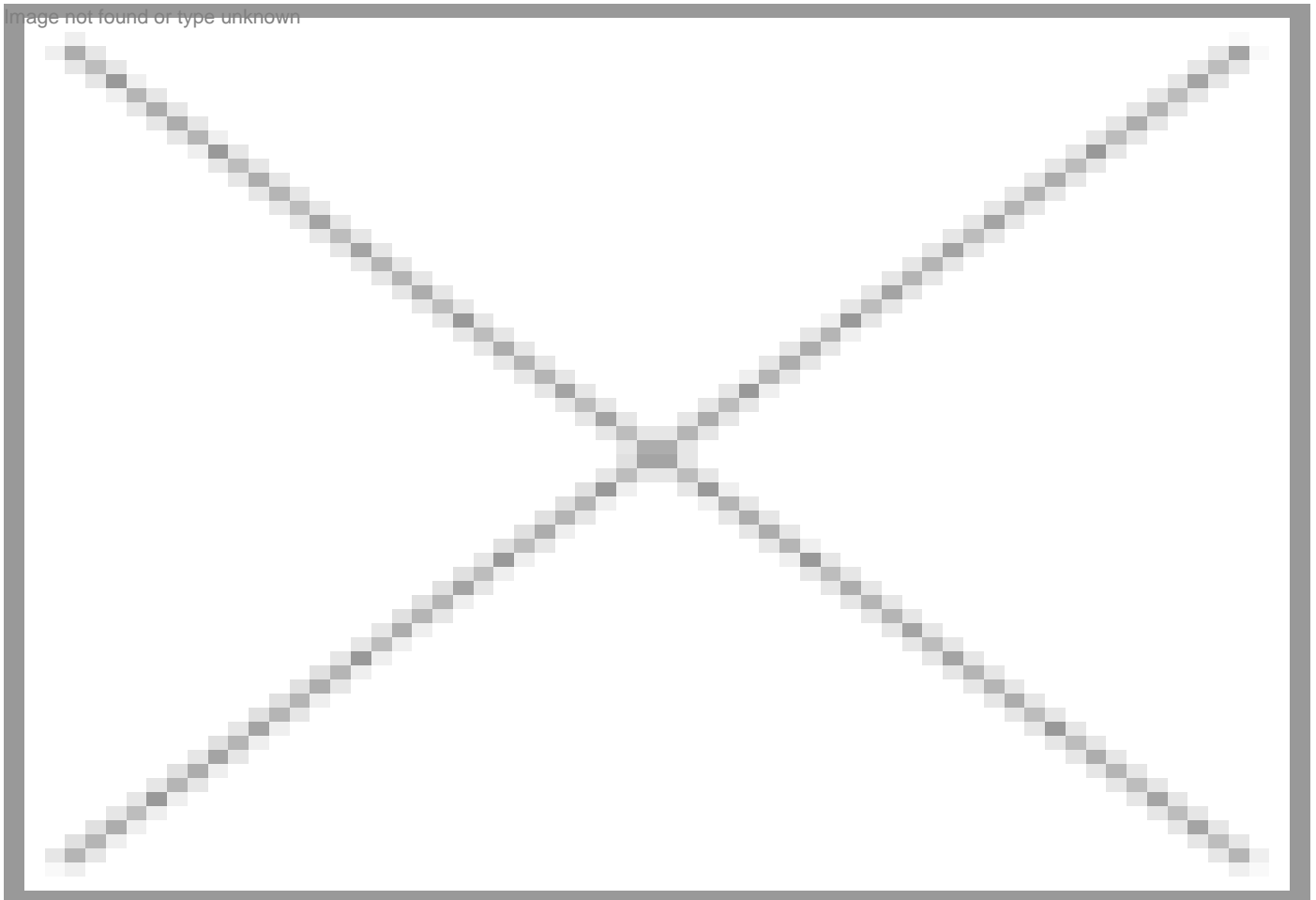


## Loyens & Loeff Belgium strengthens its Corporate/M&A
